Approval of Contract Renewal—California Community Colleges Chancellor's

Office for the Tax Offset Program (COTOP)

Background: Legislation passed in 1982 permitting community colleges to contract with the Chancellor's Office for the collection of outstanding student financial aid obligations owed to the colleges. The Chancellor's Office, acting on behalf of the colleges, may contract with the State Franchise Tax Board for the collection of outstanding or defaulted loans and overpayment of grants from any refund of taxes by the state or from state lottery winnings. Also, legislation (AB 3929, Jones) was passed in 1991 which authorized the collection of proper non-financial aid obligations owed to the District. Annually, community colleges may enter into a contract with the Chancellor's Office and submit the names of students with outstanding obligations. The Chancellor's Office retains 25% of all collections to cover administrative costs of operating the collection program.

The contract will permit the District to continue to submit the names of students with outstanding obligations, in order to permit collection of said obligations by the State Franchise Tax Board. This is a renewal of an annual contract with the Chancellor's Office, covering the period from October 1, 2011 through December 20, 2012.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the contract renewal with the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office for the Tax Offset Program (COTOP) for the period October 1, 2011 through December 20, 2011. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the contract on behalf of the District.

for the Student Health Center, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: This is a renewal of the amendment to the agreement with ValleyCare Health System (VCHS) to operate the Student Health Center at Las Positas College for an annual fee of \$ 202, 035 for the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

Las Positas College has had a working relationship with ValleyCare Health System since 1998. The Student Health Center provides health care services including non-emergency medical care, health care guidance, medical referral services and preventive health care services. Basic expenditure costs for the Student Health Center cover the full-time nurse practitioner, part-time office assistant, part-time medical assistant and medical supplies.

The Board of Trustees approved similar VCHS renewals on August 17, 2010 under item 5.12 for \$214,253 and April 15, 2008 under item 5.5b for \$284,000.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed agreement amendment renewal with ValleyCare Health System for the Student Health Center, Las Positas College, in the amount of \$ 202,035 for the period of July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012. <u>Background</u>: On February 17, 2009 the Board of Trustees approved the contract with Kwan Henmi Architecture Planning, Inc. to design the Science & Technology Building at Las Positas College. In order to take advantage of the weather and maximize the bidding schedule, the District created two phases for this project preparing a site work bid package known as Bid No. 11-03 and a construction bid package known as Bid No. 11-04, which incorporates a project specific Stormwater Pollution Protection Plan (SWPPP) for each phase and manifold redesign.

Approval of Award of Contract with Gates + Associates for Re-Design Services for the Campus Boulevard Phase I Project, Las Positas College

Background: On February 20, 2007 the Board of Trustees approved an award of an A/E Agreement to Royston Hanamoto Alley & Abey (RHAA) for the design of the Campus Boulevard Project. The original project consisted of the design of a simple ADA pathway down the center of the upper area of the campus. With all of the recent construction of new buildings at Las Positas College, it was determined that a more comprehensive design was required through the entire campus providing both an ADA pathway connecting all buildings while at the same time creating useable outdoor spaces in this central corridor connecting the upper campus, new central quad area and the lower campus. Gates + Associates was selected to design the upper section known as Phase I as they are already the Landscape Architect for the central section through the SSA project and for the lower section through the Facilities Master Plan. This approach allows the College to have one Landscape Architect to design the entire pathway through the College.

The District recommends the selection of Gates + Associates for the re-design of the Campus Boulevard Phase I Project at Las Positas College for the design development, construction documents, DSA, Bid and Construction Assistance.

Adoption of Resolution No. 02-1112—Authorization to Adopt Revised

Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act

Background: The California Legislature passed the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (PCC §22000 *et seq.*) to promote uniformity of bidding procedures and cost accounting standards for construction projects performed and/or contracted for by public entities in the State. The Act established higher bidding thresholds; simplifies the bidding process; increases the likelihood of receiving bids from responsible bidders; and minimizes the serious limitations of using our employees for public works projects.

On April 25, 2011, State Controller John Chiang, issued a letter to all public agencies subject to the terms of the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act of an Increase in the Informal Bid Limit Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22032. The letter informed the District that the informal bid limit prescribed by Section 22032 of the Public Contract Code will be increased from \$125,000 to \$175,000. With this revision, the District will continue to implement the necessary safeguards to accommodate the positive aspects of the Act while maintaining the accountability measures in our bidding processes. Through adoption by resolution, the District may avail itself of the provision in the revised Act.

RESOLUTION NO. 02-1112

AUTHORIZATION TO ADOPT REVISED UNIFORM PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION COST ACCOUNTING ACT

WHEREAS, prior to the passage of Assembly Bill no. 1666, Chap. 1054 Stats. 1983, which added Chapter 2 commencing with Section 22000 to Part 3 of Division 2 of the Public Contract Code, existing law did not provide a uniform cost accounting standard for construction work performed or contracted by local public agencies; and

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code Section 22000 et seq., the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act, establishes such a uniform cost accounting standard; and

WHEREAS, the Commission established under the Act has developed uniform public construction cost accounting procedures for implementation by local public agencies in the performance of or in the contracting for construction of public projects; and

WHEREAS, the informal bid limit prescribed by Section 22000 to Part 3 of Division 2 of the Public Contract Code, will be increased to \$175,000 effective for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CHABOT-LAS POSITAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, hereby elects under Public Contract Code Section 22032 to become subject to the uniform public construction cost accounting review procedures, as they may each from time to time be amended, and directs that the Vice Chancellor of Business Services notify the State Controller forthwith of this election.

Development

<u>Background:</u> Alameda County Social Services Agency's Children and Family Services has contracted with the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development department to provide training to group home providers and foster family agencies serving Alameda County since 2002. The County has requested training services for the 2010-11 fiscal year.

As with the previous contracts, the District will partner with community-based organizations, including Seneca Center, Fred Finch Youth Homes, St. Vincent's School for Boys, A Better Way, West Coast Children's Center and Family Paths to deliver these training services to individuals who work with foster and adoptive care children. Additionally, the Social Services Agency will utilize this resource for their employee trainings.

The contract states that Alameda County will pay the District up to \$4,298,075 for providing training services for the period July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011.

Previous Board of Trustees actions include approval of master contracts, amendments and renewals on March 19, 2002 under item 7.1; May 21, 2002 under item 7.1; May 20, 2003 under item 7.1; October 21, 2003 under item 7.3; July 20, 2004 under item 7.1; June 21, 2005 under item 7.1; June 27, 2006 under item 7.1; January 16, 2007 under item 7.1, October 21, 2008 under item 7.1 and June 23, 2009 under item 7.2.
