<u>Background</u>: This is an amendment of the Agreement No. 28812 with the Department of Rehabilitation to operate the WorkAbility III program at Las Positas College for the period of Fiscal Years 2013-2014, 2014-2015 and 2015-2016.

Las Positas College has had a working relationship with the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR) since 2002. The WorkAbility III (WAIII) program provides vocational rehabilitation service to DOR clients at Las Positas College. The specialized services offered by WAIII program include WAIII intake and vocational counseling, pre-employment workshops, employment preparation, job development and job placement

Past Board of Trustees actions include agreement approvals 2013-2016 for \$422,136 on May 21, 2013 under item 4.7, 2011-2013 for \$389,112 and 2010-2013 for \$323,064 on March 16, 2010 under item 4.11.

Approval to Travel Abroad - International Forensics Association Tournament

to Paris, France, Las Positas College

Background: The Las Positas College forensics team, LPC Talk Hawks, has been invited to participate in the International Forensics Association Tournament in Paris, France, during March 2014. Eight students and two faculty coaches would like to represent the College at the tournament. The purpose of this trip is to expose our students to the highest caliber of competition from both the United States as well as foreign institutions. This team has the potential to uphold the successful records that the LPC Talk Hawks have maintained throughout the history of the College.

The Talk Hawks have participated in this competition five times in the past: in Antwerp, Belgium (January 15, 2013 under item 4.4); Rome, Italy (November 15, 2011 under item 4.5); Montreal, Canada (November 18, 2008 under item 4.4); Buenos Aires, Argentina (November 14, 2006 under item 4.4); and Prague, Czech Republic (February 21, 2006 under item 4.4). In 2006 and 2009 LPC had the International Champion in Informative Speaking. In 2007 LPC finished as the top two-year institution at the tournament. In 2009 LPC finished 2<sup>nd</sup> Place overall at the competition, and in 2013 LPC collected six individual awards and finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> Place in the Community College Division, and 6<sup>th</sup> Place overall.

Board Policies 6216 (Field Trips) and 6217 (Travel Study Program), Administrative Rules and Procedures, and materials from our insurance broker have been reviewed. The District is in compliance with each of these and has secured all necessary and required waivers.

Approval for Establishing Non-Resident (Out-of-State and International)

Tuition Rates for 2014-2015

<u>Background:</u> In accordance with Education Code Section 76140, the Board of Trustees must set the non-resident tuition rate for the succeeding fiscal year. In establishing this amount, the District may select from one of the following seven options:

- 1. Statewide average cost.
- 2. District average cost.
- 3. District average cost with 10% or more noncredit FTES.
- 4. Contiguous district.
- 5. No more than district average cost; no less than statewide average cost.
- 6. Statewide average fee, from 2012-13 (\$193 per semester unit; \$129 per quarter unit).
- 7. No more than average tuition of 12 states with cost of living comparable to California.

The District served 375 full-time equivalent non-resident students in 2011-2012 and 381 in 2012-2013. The non-resident tuition rate of \$243.00 per semester unit was charged for the 2013-2014 academic year. The administration recommends the rate of \$243.00 per semester unit for the 2014-2015 academic year, which includes a \$17.00 per unit capital outlay fee.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed non-resident tuition rate of \$243.00 per semester unit for the 2014-2015 academic year for non-resident students, international students, and non-immigrant aliens attending on F-1 or other visa types.

Approval of Agreement – The Regents of the University of California

for Human Cadaver Material, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: This agreement with The Regents of the University of California, acting on behalf of the University of California, San Francisco, Department of Anatomy/Willed Body Program, and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District is to provide Las Positas College with human cadaver material for educational, and research activities at the College.

Construction of a new state-of-the-art Science Building at Las Positas College was completed in Summer 2012. This new building includes a cadaver laboratory specifically designed to house human cadaver material. An Anatomical Material Request Application was submitted to UCSF on November 13, 2013, to start the process of acquiring human cadaver material. The UCSF Willed Body Program conducted a site visit as part of the application process on November 26, 2013. The cadaver laboratory, surrounding area, and cadaver laboratory safety plan were reviewed. The site report indicated that Las Positas College is equipped for the proper use, handling, and storage of anatomical materials. Las Positas College will be able to move forward with the cadaver material acquisition in spring 2014, once this agreement is approved.

The term of the proposed agreement will commence January 22, 2014 through January 21, 2019. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time for any reason upon sixty (60) days' prior written notice. The fee for the cadaver and transportation is \$2,760.

The initial Services Agreement plus additional sub-contractor's change order and contingency is estimated to be a not to exceed budget of \$4,300,000 for Building 2000, Library Renovation at Las Positas College.
