BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been contracting with Alameda County Social Services Agency, Children and Family Services providing services for the Parent Resources, Information, Development and Education pre-service training program for many years. The State developed a uniform name and requirements for all State pre-service training programs beginning January 2017. The services requested for the 2025-26 school year at Chabot College and Las Positas College essentially remain the same as the past several years.

Training classes were traditionally offered in person, which required childcare, food, and various learning materials. With Covid-19, most classes pivoted to Zoom. Now, caregivers have both online and in-person options and childcare was reintroduced in 2023-24. CPR classes are required and have remained in-person.

The RFA classes inform and prepare potential foster and adoptive parents in making successful, permanent connections with foster youth. These classes are required for resource families who were formerly known as adoptive parents, foster parents, kinship families and guardians. Classes are also available to respite providers

and the general public who are interested in understanding the needs of children in out-of-home care, and are under the protection of the Department's Foster Care System.

The Alameda County Social Service Agency will recommend for approval to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors, the preliminary grant renewal amount of \$288,900 for the period of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026. The most recent renewal was in 2024, under Agenda Item 4.2 of the October 15, 2024 meeting agenda for \$288,900.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

Chabot College has received notification from the Alameda County Social Services Agency of its intent to renew a grant for the continuation of services for the Community Action to Reach Out to Infants (CARI) Program.

Under the CARI Program, the College provides specialized, pre-designed training for potential Resource Families (previously Foster Parents, Kinship Caregivers) and Respite Providers to care for children that enter Alameda County's Child Protective Services through drug exposure, HIV, neglect or abuse. This will be the twenty-first year the Alameda County Board of Supervisors has chosen to reconfirm its dedication to the ideals of service to the community through the maintenance of this partnership with the College.

The Alameda County Social Service Agency will recommend for approval, to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors, the grant renewal amount of \$41,200. The contract is effective for services rendered from July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026. The Board of Trustees initially approved this grant in 2003, as item 4.2 of the August 19, 2003 meeting agenda. The most recent renewal was in 2024, under item 4.1 of the October 15, 2024 meeting agenda for \$41,200.

The City of Fremont and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) have entered in the past a Community Media Center Facility Use Agreement for the City to use the College's TV Studio and related facilities for Public, Educational and Government (PEG) access programming and production. This agreement was last approved by the Board as item 4.5 on July 17, 2018.

The City has provided written notice to enter into a subsequent contract, for September 1, 2025, through August 30, 2029, pending Board approval. The City will, under the terms of the renewal, remit to the District the sum of \$150,000 each year for access to the TV Studio and facilities in accordance with the terms of the Agreement. The contract provides for three one-year extensions with written notice.

Arctic Wolf provides "concierge" security operations for organizations using a combination of trained expert personnel and a cloud-based platform for vulnerability management, monitoring, detection, and response at a cost of \$132,972.24.

In 2022, the District contracted with Arctic Wolf to provide a Security Operations Center as a Service (SOCaaS). The service continuously (24/7/365) and proactively monitors the District's data environment to detect and assist with responses to cyber security incidents. Arctic Wolf is a central piece of the District's cyber security infrastructure. It would require five FTE to provide the 24-hour support Arctic Wolf offers. Cloud-based and locally housed systems are included in the service to provide coverage regardless of how the systems are managed.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

CLPCCD has been approved as a Host Partner site for two Climate Action Fellows as part of the Office of the Governor's California Climate Action Corps (CACC), designed to build resilience within communities to the impacts of climate change and foster increased climate service opportunities for Californians. CCAC is part of a larger statewide initiative to address the climate crisis by placing emerging leaders with public agencies, nonprofits, tribal communities, and educational institutions to mobilize communities through volunteer engagement, climate action, and education service projects focused on urban greening, organic waste and edible food recovery, and wildfire resiliency. BACR has contracted with AmeriCorps through California Volunteers to implement the California Climate Action Fellowship. Each Climate Action Fellow will serve a minimum 1700 hours from September 15, 2025 to August 14th, 2026 for an average of 40 hours per week, participating in climate volunteer engagement, direct climate action, climate education and outreach. Fellows will attend training and professional development activities along with attending CACC monthly meetings while advancing district-wide climate action goals including a focus on the Zero Waste Initiative, composting of organics and edible food recovery, and urban greening projects. Each Fellow will receive a living stipend as paid volunteers of \$40,000 working for BACR within the District for the eleven-month service period, paid biweekly through BACR/CACC, totaling \$80,000 of in-kind external funding to the District for the two Climate Action Fellows.
