2221 FLAG RAISING

References: 36 U.S. Code, Section 174(a)

The flag of the United States will be flown on all days during which the District is open for business, whether classes are in session or not, and at other times as designated by the Board of Trustees and/or the Chancellor.

The flag of the United States shall be flown at half staff when the entire nation is in mourning. These periods of mourning are proclaimed either by the President of the United States for national remembrance or the State Governor for local remembrance in the event of a death of a member or former member of the federal, state, or territorial government or judiciary.

The flag of the United States should only fly at half staff for 30 days at all federal buildings and grounds throughout the United States after the death of a President, the Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court, a retired Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court, or the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The President of the United States may order the flag of the United States to be flown at half staff to mark the death of other officials, former officials, or foreign dignitaries. In addition to these occasions, the President of the United States may order half staff display of the flag of the United States after other tragic events.

Manner of Hoisting

- The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously

Inclement Weather

- The flag should not be displayed on days when the weather is inclement, except when an all weather flag is displayed

Display on or Near Administration Building of Public Institutions

- The flag should be displayed daily on or near the Administration Building
