


MISSION and VALUES

OUR SHARED PROGRESS (2024-25 Highlights)

Enrollment stability and growth in key areas:

- Since 2022-23, our enrollment has increased by approximately 22%
- 30% increase in number of students with a SEP
- Financial Aid:
 - 24% increase in # of students receiving a Promise Grant
 - 30% increase in # of students receiving a Pell Grant



OUR SHARED PROGRESS (2024-25 Highlights)

Winter Intersession Implementation:

 Expands opportunities for students to advance their goals and creates an opportunity to grow enrollment further


Apprenticeship and Workforce Development:

 Increased to approximately 3,000 students, with programs expanding from 11 to 20 and grant funding tripling to \$3.7M

Base (incl. Basic) Supplemental



SCFF Funding Composition by Allocation Type (% of Total, 2022-23 to 2025-26)





HOLISTIC ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT 2025-26 PLANNING TARGETS

- Enrollment: Increase FTES by 8.35% year-over-year
- Applications: Increase new student application rate 5% from prior year
- Financial aid: Increase financial aid application rate 5% from prior year
- Completion and Retention: Increase SEP rate 5% from prior year











