Nominated by: Scott Hildreth Dr. Safiyyah Forbes joined Chabot as Dean for our division at the start of the pandemic in 2020, in what had to be the most challenging of circumstances for any new colleague, let alone as Dean responsible for the enormous range of lecture and lab classes we offer. However, despite never having the chance until this Spring, 2022, to meet her entire team of instructors and classified professionals in person, Dr. Forbes has been exceptional in creating a warm, caring, and effective climate for all of us. In addition, she supported the myriad of student and faculty challenges because of COVID. She advocated creative uses for new funds to pay for home lab kits and additional supplies that would allow our students to complete their required work flexibly.

One of the first things Dr. Forbes implemented to help our team was a weekly coffee chat on ZOOM, of course, where our colleagues were allowed to vent, share ideas, and offer support. And while this itself might not be unique, Dr. Forbes made herself available seven days a week for one-on-one ZOOMs. And she did this for students who were facing equally daunting challenges with their classes.

Dr. Forbes has juggled our incredibly complex schedule, adjunct, and full-time hiring, funding, participation in the HSI Stem Grant, launching one new building (3200), and planning for another major building project (2100). In addition, she supported our efforts to improve equity and diversity and managed challenging personnel issues with sincere grace. She has done all of this while also dealing with personal health challenges.

Dr. Forbes is doing a superb job as Dean and deserves recognition for not just surviving these last two years – her first at Chabot – but for helping us all survive these previous two years. We were lucky to find her, fortunate to hire her, and well-off with her by our side."

Howard Blumenfeld


Faculty



He also participated in a grant-funded program to increase access to quality online classes. The Business Access and Quality grant included faculty training in preparing online classes to meet California community colleges' highest online learning standards. These courses are now part of the completely online Supervisory Management Certificate. Drew also pioneered noncredit business courses at LPC, writing a curriculum in record time and providing additional business education opportunities for our community."

Drew brings his professional sales, marketing, and entrepreneurial expertise to marketing and recruitment efforts for the Business Studies Program, helping produce student videos and enhancing the program website. His students consistently write positive comments about him in anonymous surveys, describing him as knowledgeable, fun, and engaging.

Hermina Sarkis-Kelly


Instructional Assistant Computer Studies
