Dear CLPCCD Community,

In light of recent concerns regarding potential federal immigration enforcement measures, we reaffirm our dedication to upholding the protections outlined in California's sanctuary jurisdiction laws, Senate Bill (SB) 54 (the California Values Act) and Assembly Bill (AB) 21. These laws safeguard individuals' rights, foster a supportive campus environment, and prohibit the use of community college resources for federal immigration enforcement except as explicitly required by law.

Key Protections and Guidelines:

- *SB 54 (California Values Act):* Campus safety and police are prohibited from assisting federal immigration enforcement activities or sharing personal information unless required by a judicial warrant.
- *AB 21:* Personal information will not be disclosed, and immigration officers seeking campus access must follow legal procedures. Emergency contacts will be notified if a community member is detained, and comprehensive support is available for students, faculty, and staff affected by immigration actions.

District Resources:
