To honor and retain the expertise of retiring members of the Board of Trustees, the Board has created the title of Trustee Emeritus.

1. Qualifications for Trustees

A member of the Board of Trustees who has served two or more terms of office shall qualify for "Trustee Emeritus" status.

2. Recognition and Privileges

By action of the Governing Board, qualified retirees shall have the title "Emeritus" conferred upon them and shall have lifetime continuation of their names in the college catalog. Trustees Emeriti also shall be provided appropriate privileges consistent with Board policy and tradition.

3. Eligibility for Service to the District

With or without remuneration, as appropriate, all Trustee Emeriti shall be eligible for appointment within the scope of their credentials and qualifications to:

- a. serve on college committees in an advisory capacity;
- b. engage in special projects or studies;
- c. accept part-time assignments;
- d. perform administrative or supervisory functions.

It is the desire of the Governing Board to honor and to retain as a resource for the district the expertise and, as appropriate, the services of retiring faculty, managers, and classified professionals.

1. Qualifications for Employees (Faculty, Managers, and Classified Professionals)

An employee who meets the following conditions may qualify for emeritus status:

- a. has been entered into retirement from the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District;
- b. has been an employee with regular classification;
- c. has engaged in a minimum of ten (10) years of full-time service to the district.

2. Recognition and Privileges

Upon recommendation of the chancellor and by action of the Governing Board,

qualified retirees shall have the title "Emeritus" conferred upon them and shall have lifetime continuation of their names in the college catalog. Faculty, Managers, and Staff Emeriti also shall be provided appropriate privileges consistent with Board policy and tradition.

3. Eligibility for Service to the District

With or without remuneration, as appropriate, all emeriti shall be eligible for appointment within the scope of their credentials and qualification to:

- a. serve on college committees in an advisory capacity;
- b. engage in special projects or studies;
- c. accept part-time assignments;
- d. perform administrative or supervisory functions.
